I was born January 11, 1979 to Susan Diane Stevens and Kevin Lee Cross. My Dad is Eunice's son, my grandma's son in other words. My parents divorced when I was a young, young man, (around 3, I think). For a long time, that memory recalls, I pretty much lived at Grandma Gray's. (That's why I always absolutely loved being around Grandma and Grandpa Gray, where ever we might have been going or doing at the time!)
