Hildegard Victoria Dickey, 91, a long time Greens Fork Resident, died Thursday, February 11, 2016, at Reid Hospital.

She was born in Sattl, Czechoslovakia on October 27, 1924 to Englebert and Emma (Heinz) Lerch

She met her husband, E. Benjamin Dickey and came to the U.S. with him at the close of WW II. He preceded her in death in 1985. She lived in the Greens Fork area for 65 years before moving to Heritage House in Richmond a few years ago.
