



## Lucille B. Stout-Dilling

November 26, 1930 - February 6, 2020

Lucille B. Stout-Dilling, 89, a long time Hagerstown area resident, died Thursday, February 6, 2020 at The Waters of New Castle, where she had resided for the past few years.

She was born near Hagerstown on November 26, 1930 to Clarence and Martha (Hilbert) Belt and was a life long resident of the area. She was a member of Nettle Creek Church of the Brethren, where she had served as piano player for 70 years, beginning at age 10. She had been employed at Perfect Circle, was co-owner of The Tea Room and operated a beauty salon for many years. She was also a member of Red Hat Society.
