



Marjorie A. Jarrett

February 1, 1934 - January 29, 2025

Marjorie-Anne Lillian (Tomlinson) Jarrett, age 90, passed away peacefully at the Willows in New Castle. She was born on February 1, 1934, in Ft. McMurray, Alberta, Canada to Samuel and Lillian Whitaker Tomlinson. She was baptized and confirmed in the Church of England.

Marjorie was raised in Lac Du Bonnet, Manitoba, Canada and graduated from high school in 1951. While growing up in Canada, she participated in softball and curling, which she continued to be a life-long enthusiast and Winter Olympic follower. After graduation, she moved to Calgary and attended Business College before joining the Royal Canadian Air Force. She served in Montreal for two years and proudly was on parade in Montreal for the celebration of Queen Elizabeth II coronation in June 1953. Marjorie then transferred to Metz, France where she met her husband Jack, who was serving in the US Air Force. While serving, she was able to travel to many other locations including Germany, Italy, England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales.

After her service she returned to Canada briefly, where Jack and Marjorie had their first child, before making their way back to Hagerstown to raise their family. She was active in bowling leagues and had long-term friendships with many of the ladies from her monthly card club. She was a member of New Testament Church of Christ and American Legion Ladies Auxiliary, Post 333. While always a proud Canadian, she became an American citizen in 1996. In addition to her parents and loving husband Jack, she was preceded in

death by her brothers Sammy and Jack, and sister Bea, along with two grandsons Jason Chaney and Jordan Marlatt, who she loved more than life. Marjorie is survived by sons Jay (Rose) Jarrett, Tod (Jeanine) Jarrett; daughters Lisa (Mac) Marlatt and Tracy (Rick) Jones; grandchildren Hannah (Kevin) Knight, Hailey Jones and Samera (Kenney) Holland, Kasey and daughters Fallon, McKenzie and Brynlie; great grandchildren Kenslie Marlatt, Jackson and Charlotte Knight, Haylee and Maycee Holland. Her special in laws Nick and Judy Jarrett and Beverly McClintock, special niece Mary MacDonald in Canada, and many more loving nieces and nephews.
