When her kids were young, she was a Girl Scout troop leader, a Cub Scout leader, was a member of a bowling team, and attended her monthly card club meetings. She was part of a group who started the slow-pitch softball league in Hagerstown, which is now a part of Hagerstown Little League. She loved to bake and cook for her family and anyone who entered her kitchen. Family was everything to Pat and she was always in attendance at her grandchildren and great-grandchildren’s sporting events. She loved Tiger Athletics, and you could count on a bag of cookies afterwards, which were renowned in East Central Indiana. She proudly wore the moniker of “cookie grandma”, bestowed upon her by friends of grandchildren and great-grandchildren alike. The cookies were remarkable, but Pat was also known for her famous pies. Her love language was baking a pie for you. Whether it was to celebrate, mourn, or just to say hello, receiving a pie from Pat’s kitchen was a special treat. Pat and Raymond graciously took their family on many vacations to Myrtle Beach and other destinations over the years. Pat was very special to the dance community in Hagerstown. 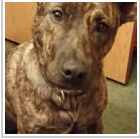
