Reba J. Deaton, 91, a long time Hagerstown resident, died at her home in Centerville on Saturday, September 12, 2015.

She was born in Randolph County on August 7, 1924 to Howard and Naomi (Sharp) Johnson and lived in Hagerstown from 1940 until moving to Centerville 3 years ago.

She was a 1942 graduate of Hagerstown High School. On February 7, 1948 she married Dexter Deaton. He preceded her in death on June 22, 2005 following 57 years of marriage. Reba was employed at Perfect Circle/Dana Corp. from 1942 until her retirement in 1980. She was an avid bowler and a member of Huntsville Girls Club and Perfect Circle 25 year club. She was also a member of Hagerstown First United Methodist Church.
