Ted L. Winters, 69, of Hagerstown, died Saturday, July 30, 2016.

He was born in New Castle on April 14, 1947 to Paul and Marguerite (Harcourt) Winters and was a life long resident of Hagerstown.

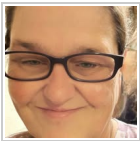

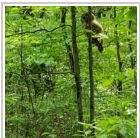
