



## Theodore S. Williamson

April 23, 1943 - March 24, 2021

Theodore S. "Ted" Williamson, 77, of Greens Fork, died at his home on Wednesday, March 24, 2021.

He was born in Woodsfield, OH on April 23, 1943 to Theodore and Hazel (Strickland) Williamson. He resided in Ohio until moving to the Greens Fork area about 30 years ago. A toolmaker, Ted owned and operated TEGA in Dayton for many years. After moving to Greens Fork, he raised cattle for several years. He was an avid reader and, always wanting to work with his hands, he restored cars and maintained a machine shop at his home.

Survivors include his wife, Sharon DeAolia-Williamson; 2 children, Jon Eric (Aimee) Williamson and Cheryl (Brian) Williamson-Jackson; 3 sisters, Joy (Steven) Seeskin, Bonnie Jae Dane and Sue (Tom) Fellers; nieces and nephews.
